

Add route: Rhone cycle route

Applicant:

Region Rhône-Alpes (on behalf of 4 Swiss Cantons, 3 French Regions, other authorities responsible for developing the cycle route and tourism and communication stakeholders.

Proposal:

Add a new Rhone Cycle Route to the EuroVelo network ('EuroVelo 17')

Length: 1,151.52 km



Add Major section: EuroVelo 1 - Iceland

Applicant:

The Icelandic Tourist Board (ITB) in cooperation with the Icelandic Cyclists' Federation (IHM).

Proposal:

Add a route in Iceland to EuroVelo 1 – Atlantic Coast Route

Length: 900 km



Add major section: EuroVelo 1 - Portugal

Applicant:

Federação Portuguesa de Cicloturismo e Utilizadores de Bicicleta (FPCUB)

Proposal:

Extend EuroVelo 1 – Atlantic Coast Route from its current ending point of Sagres up the Portuguese Atlantic Coast to the border with Spain.
